School Readiness

School readiness is foundational across early childhood years. It refers to whether a child is ready to make an easy and successful transition into school means children are ready for school, families are ready to support their children's learning, and schools are ready for children. Physical, cognitive, social, and emotional developments are all essential ingredients of school readiness laying the foundation for continuous success in school. “School readiness” describes the capabilities of children, their families, schools, and communities that will best promote student success in kindergarten and beyond. Each component - children, families, schools, and communities - plays an essential role in the development of school readiness.



Context

Early Years are Foundation Stage, there is ample opportunity for children to learn, grow and thrive. Early school years are a critical period for learning & development. Early experiences enhance school success. More than half of the children enter class I without Pre School Education (PSE). Children with Pre School Education, show higher scores on readiness variables than children without PSE. On the basis of the above inference drawn is that school readiness programme of 06 months duration, for children entering

class I without and with pre School education, in the beginning of class would be essential for adjustment in school and benefitting from classroom transactions.



Objectives:

- Promotes holistic development of child
- Prepares child for formal schooling
- Reduces wastage and stagnation at primary school

Why are school readiness skills important?

The development of school readiness skills allows school teachers to expand and further develop a child's skills in the specific areas of social interaction, play, language, emotional development, physical skills, literacy and fine motor skills.



What the child will know:

- Knows full name
- Is learning to play and share with others
- Uses pictures to tell stories
- Is learning to explore new things
- Is learning to write down name
- Speaks in five or six word sentences.
- Follows simple rules and routines
- Shows curiosity

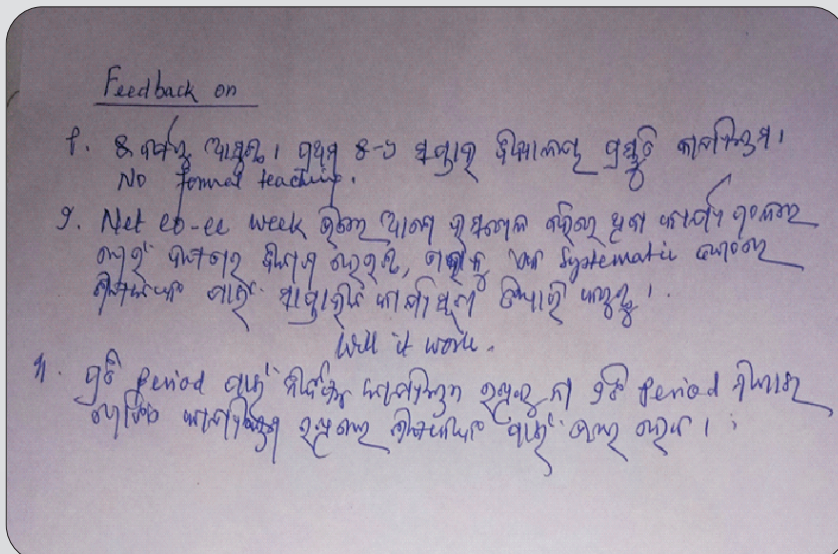
School Readiness Goals:

Three dimensions of school readiness are interlinked, building competencies and preparedness in children, schools and families.

- Children - focusing on children's learning and development.
